A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Children of the Heavenly Father,

Have you ever wondered why God chose to pattern Himself after the earthly example of a "father?" He did okay when He likened Himself to a "shepherd" tending His sheep, or an "eagle" lifting us above life's problems, or a "hen" protecting us under the cover of its wings. But why a "father"?!?

If that's the earthly example He uses, does that mean that God spends most of His time at work, instead of at home? Or does it mean He is never satisfied with what we do, and yells at us much of the time? Or could it mean that when we need His help or counsel, He responds to us with a stern glare and an irritable word? Or does it mean He makes a lot of promises, but never keeps them when bigger things arise?

THANK GOD, HE IS NOT LIKE US! God did NOT pattern Himself after earthly fathers; instead, He wants earthly fathers to pattern themselves after him!

Our heavenly Father loves us. He demonstrated this so fully by sending Jesus to take our punishment. The physical pain was great, but the wrath of a just and holy Father (God) was far greater and was placed directly on Jesus. 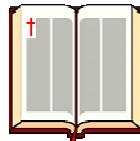
